<p>Reading Read a book of your choice for 20 minutes a day. Use a dictionary to find the meaning of any new words you discover.</p> <p>Spelling Check the spelling lists on the class website. Challenge yourself to correctly spell a list of your choice. Move onto the next list if you get them all correct.</p> <p>Writing <u>Fiction</u> – Write an imaginative story titled “Lost in Space”. Remember – paragraphs, wow words, punctuation, dialogue, character and setting descriptions. <u>Non-Fiction</u> – Create a fact file about influential engineers. (Elon Musk, Ada Lovelace, Leonardo Da Vinci, Ellen Ochoa, Alexander Graham Bell, Edith Clarke, John Logie Baird, Beatrix Shilling etc.)</p> <p>Talking & Listening Watch Newsround and discuss global events with someone in your house. Prepare and present your writing to everyone in your house. Remember LOUD, CLEAR, LOOK AT THE AUDIENCE.</p>	<p>Number Times table Practice – Write out your times tables and get someone to quiz you on them. Can you recite them all without looking? <u>Check Sumdog for the Daily Class Competition.</u> Complete a division worksheet that is on our website (there are 3 stars to choose from). Use these videos to help if you're unsure - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=SLze82Zcc4Y or https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FAPcjdAhnY</p> <p>Topic maths <u>Challenge:</u> A local bookshop donated 100200 new library books to be distributed equally among 24 primary schools. The genre of the books were - 40% fiction, 40% non-fiction and 20% reference. 'How many books of each genre did each school receive?' Time – Write out a plan for each day. Include the time you will do things and how long they will last. Symmetry Art – Create a piece of art that has 2 lines of symmetry. Challenge yourself to more lines of symmetry if you can. Remember, the colours will also have to match symmetrically.</p>

Earth Hour is on 28 March at 8:30pm when we try to turn off as many electrical appliances as possible. Make a list of everything in your house that uses electricity. What could you switch off that you don't need? What swaps could you make? Why is it important to cut down the electricity we use? Make a poster to advertise what people could do to cut down on using electricity. Technology – Home learning means spending more time online looking at websites and YouTube etc. What can you do to make sure you stay safe online?</p>

	<p>World Challenge – Write down and then memorise at least 20 countries and their capital cities!</p> <p>Relaxation Task – Find a quiet spot, close your eyes and see how long you can meditate for. Focus on your breath and be still (just like we did when learning about Buddhism).</p> <p>Night Time Task – Make a list of what you did today and what you hope to do tomorrow.</p>

List ten countries


you would like to visit by the time you are 25 years old
