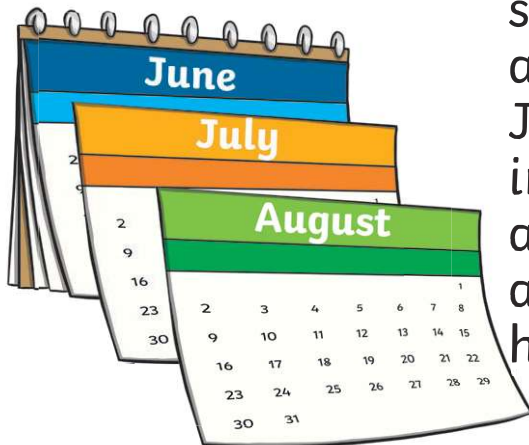

Summer



Summer is one of the four seasons. It comes after spring and before autumn. The months June, July and August are in summer. Schools close for around six weeks in summer and lots of people go away on holiday.

Summer is the warmest season, with the weather often being hot and sunny. It can still rain in summer. More thunderstorms occur during summer than any other season.



The summer solstice is the day with the longest hours of daylight and when the sun reaches its highest point in the sky. This happens around the 21st of June each year. Some people celebrate the summer solstice with a party or ceremony.

There is lots of wildlife to see in the summer. Look out for flowers, butterflies, bees, beetles and even bats!
